our last crusade in northern Zulu Land went well. At the beginning we had to deal with the typical challenges: Our most important co-worker had to go back to Durban during prayer time because his daughter had disappeared. At the same time, we received the news that the best friend of our daughter Carolina, who studied with her in Johannesburg, had to return to Zimbabwe immediately because her visa was not extended. This was very discouraging news. However, in the end, everything was half as bad as it seemed to us at that moment.

This time we had visitors from Germany in the first half of the crusade. Two lovely women from a Munich congregation came to support us. Especially in the children's ministry, but also during school visits and devotions, they enriched us with their contributions.

Otherwise, the campaign was peaceful, and we were able to do our work undisturbed. On one of the evenings, a well-known local musician performed with his choir in our Gospel tent. Interestingly, he was obviously nervous, although he is used to performing at events. He said that it was the presence of God that would make it difficult for him to sing in our tent.



Last week I received a testimony from Mrs. Gumede, who had come forward to pray during our healing service. We always have this "special" service at the end of the first week. In principle, it is a normal, evangelistic service with the only difference that after the altar call for salvation, we also call the sick to the front to pray for them. Otherwise, we always do this after the end of the event. This time, too, so many people came forward that it was impossible for us to take the time to listen to everyone's concerns. So, we walked through the rows praying and laying on hands. That doesn't feel very effective. But we do not trust in our feelings, but in the power of God! And He has promised that He will confirm the gospel proclamation! Mrs. Gumede had womb cancer and after the crusade she had an appointment at the hospital to have it removed. When she was examined there, there was no more cancer, and she was able to go home immediately!

We also heard good news from Pastor Khathwayo, with whom we have been working in the area for many years. Two years ago, we prayed in his home for his wife, who had been diagnosed with lung cancer. Since then, she was healed, as another check-up recently confirmed.

Our next crusade is scheduled to take place in November in the Drakensberg area. Please pray for it.
